This is used for providing noon meal to needy students. Students also raise funds in innovative ways and a substantial amount was collected for mission work. The college as well as individual departments provide financial assistance to poor students through freeships etc. Some departments have taken the lead in organizing visits to poor homes and orphanages.

Mentoring by teachers and personal counselling by professional counsellors are arranged on a regular basis. An innovative programme undertaken this year was the taking up of a particular value by each department and spreading the message by putting up posters in the campus, conducting programmes, taking documentaries and incorporating the value into curricular activities.

Intercollegiate paper presentation competitions, individual research projects for PG and UG students, participation in seminars, workshops outside the college etc equip students to keep pace with their peers. Environment friendly activities such as practices for sustainable development – vermin-composting, nature club activities, seminars and awareness programmes on judicious use of resources train students in eco friendly living.

## **26 . Health Services**

There is a hospital barely 1 km from the college and students are taken there in case of emergency. Some departments maintain First Aid boxes and common medicines are available in the college store. This year the Social Work Department organized a one day eye camp on 4<sup>th</sup> October 2008 camp in collaboration with Vasan Eye Care, Kottayam; around 300 students and staff participated in the programme. A need assessment survey for identifying students of lower economic status having eye problems was conducted by the department of Social Work in collaboration with the Mukkadan Trust on 23<sup>rd</sup> November 2008. 15 students from various departments of Assumption College were identified and were referred for free Eye Care treatment. Blood Group Detection Camp was conducted by the depts. of Home Science and Social Work in collaboration with Red Ribbon Club for the staff, non- teaching staff and students of the college. the Department of Family and Community Science also conducts periodical health check ups- Total fat, Body Water Content and Weight of students and staff of the college
